BENEFICIARY DESIGNATIONS

A reminder that within the next couple of weeks the Defense Finance and Accounting Service will be sending to Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, and Army (active and reserve components) retirees their *Retiree Account Statement*. Check to ensure that your Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) Coverage in formation is correct in the block at the bottom of the Statement. Also, check on the reverse page to make sure your Arrears of Pay Beneficiary Information block contains the correct information/beneficiary designation.

I mentioned in the last newsletter that the CRMF now has a Vanguard Brokerage account set up for stock donations. If you are interested, please call me at 360-834-2448 for the Vanguard account and DTC numbers to tell your financial institution.

Here are a number of ways to support the CRMF:

- 1. Donate Cash (i.e., check).
- 2. Linking your Fred Meyer Rewards Card to the CRMF.
- 3. Linking your Smile.Amazon.com account to the CRMF.
- 4. Using a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA as part of your RMD. Benefit: QCD's reduce the AGI on the front of your IRS Form 1040 by the amount of your OCD.
- 5. 2020 Only: The CARES Act allows donors to receive an above-the-line charitable cash contribution credit up to \$300 for donations to 501(c)3 charities (which the CRMF is one) only if you do NOT itemize.
- 6. 2020 Only: The CARES Act allows taxpayers WHO ITEMIZE their deductions to deduct charitable contributions up to 100% of their AGI thus offering the ability to wipe out their tax liability entirely.
- 7. Donating appreciated securities held at least one year directly to the CRMF. By doing so, you avoid paying capital gains on the value of these shares. Both you and the CRMF benefit.
- 8. Leaving a bequest. This is as simple as listing the Columbia River MOAA Foundation (CRMF) in your will/trust as a charitable beneficiary. Our EIN is 47-4776049.

I really miss seeing and chatting with all of you and hope we can do so VERY soon in 2021.
