- IRC 501(c)(3) Charitable Non-Profit
- Registered as Charitable Non-Profit with State of Washington Secretary of State
- Founded as subsidiary of CRC in 2015
- Board: 4 Elected CRMF Officers + CRC Board
- Foundation Manages Two Different Funds
 - Scholarship Fund
 - Support the Troops Fund



Scholarship Fund (2019)



WSU - Vancouver

- One Scholarship, \$1,500
- Traditionally paid 100% from our Scholarship Fund
- Started building a scholarship endowment

Clark College

- Three Scholarships, \$1,000 each
- Partly funded from the MOAA Scholarship Endowment managed by Clark College Foundation (2020 est = \$2,000)
- Balance paid from CRMF Scholarship Fund (2020 est = \$1,000)
- Began gathering historical info for Clark College Scholarships
- Fund Reserve: \$8,500.

2019 Audit



- Last Audit 2 Dec 2019
 - Overall Assessment Excellent with no discrepancies
 - Recommendations:
 - Improve (CRC/CRMF) procedures for handling funds when mail is picked up by officers other than CRC or CRMF Treasurer
 - Improve audit trail for cash donations received at events

- No fraud or loss of funds (well intentioned)
- No checks or funds were lost but it resulted in a bookkeeping challenge for the two Treasurers
- CRC and CRMF Treasurers will make coordinated recommendations to the two Boards as to how to mitigate the risks


