This event, and a similar event in Portland, brought our local community into national attention. For those of us that have served our Nation, "free and fair elections" is recognized as a benchmark of our democracy.

Looking forward, upcoming CRC luncheons include a presentation on identity and cyber security (our November Thanksgiving meeting) and a visit by MOAA National (our December Christmas meeting). old when you get to meet her in December)! Simon received the Clark College President's Award to WSU-V and now has received our scholarship at WSU-V. Simon was a combat army medic and served 11 months in Iraq in that capacity. He's now pursuing his BSN while working at Avamere Skilled Nursing and Rehabilitation in Portland.

By the time you read this, I will have met our three Clark College scholarship recipients, Donald "Ray" Jackson, Gabriela Jecan, and Eric Morton, at the Clark College Scholarship Reception and learned a little about them and their studies. All three plan to attend our December meeting at the Old Spaghetti Factory so you can meet them as well.

Reflecting on our scholarships, we were the first scholarship donor at WSU-V in the 1993-94 school year (the Col James Allen scholarship). Our then \$600 scholarship amounted to about 30% of annual tuition. Today, our \$1,500 scholarship amounts to about 14% of a year's tuition. As our endowment balance grows, we hope to increase our WSU-V scholarship.

These scholarships are only made possible by the generosity of our members. We thank you and we know our recipients do as well.

DID YOU KNOW THE DOD HAS A NEW UPDATED MILITARY ID CARD?,

Next Generation Uniformed Services ID Card



The Department of Defense transitioned from its legacy paper-based Uniformed Services Identification (USID) card to a more secure, next

generation USID card.

The Next Generation USID card incorporates an updated design and security features to deter counterfeiting and fraud and is printed on a plastic card stock.

Initial issuance of the Next Generation USID card began on July 31, 2020, at select DoD ID card facilities, with phased implementation at all DoD ID card facilities, and completed in December 2020.

USID cards are issued to retired and reserve members, dependent family members of uniformed Service members, and other eligible individuals in accordance with DoD policy to facilitate access to benefits, privileges, and DoD bases.

The Next Generation USID card does not change the populations who are eligible to receive the current card.

Legacy USID cards remain valid through their expiration date, however, individuals with an indefinite (INDEF) expiration date on their legacy USID card may replace those ID cards with a Next Generation USID card.

USID cards may now be renewed online. Please see the <u>online USID card renewal page</u> for more information.

To easily order your badge, you may contact them by email <u>badges@alohabadges.com</u> or by phone, (503) 430-0234

They already have our MOAA logo on file, so there is no setup fee.

Make sure you specify the "registered mark" logo, with rounded corners. Also that you are with the Columbia River Chapter. Although my badge looks beige in the photo, it's actually white.

Prices: for 3x1.5 inch: \$6.75.

You may specify fasteners. I ordered magnets, works fine for me.

After you order, they will send a photo of your badge. After you are happy with the proof, they will mail the badge and invoice you for payment.
